

ACCEPTABLE AND PROHIBITED MATERIALS

ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS	
WOOD	Plywood, chipboard, medium density fiberboard, glued laminated timber
METAL	Steel, aluminum, copper, ICW, UBC, and all other metals
AGGREGATE	Concrete, asphalt, rock, and masonry
CARDBOARD / PAPER	Clean and dirty
PLASTIC	Film and rigid
DRYWALL	Scrap and demolition ¹
OTHER	Any other construction and demolition ¹ waste except for the prohibited materials below

PROHIBITED MATERIALS
Liquids, items containing liquid, and saturated material
Gas-filled containers (including, but not limited to, propane bottles)
Household garbage
Commercial garbage
Hazardous materials ² or anything containing hazardous materials
Uncertified demolition ¹ waste
Biomedical waste
Asbestos or materials suspected of containing asbestos
Lead paint
Fluorescent light bulbs
Batteries
Burned materials
Telephone poles, railroad ties, or other materials treated with creosote
Any other materials that present a risk to our employees, equipment or facility as exclusively determined by the site supervisor in his or her sole discretion

NOTES

- TWO BOX RULE** - Please note that the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission prefers that operators of construction or demolition sites where recyclable materials are generated and transported for recycling provides a separate container for non-recyclable material that is collected by a certified hauler. Customer should maintain a separate container for non-recyclable material that is collected by a certified hauler.
- Demolition waste is acceptable only when from a known site and accompanied by a Hazardous Materials Survey/ Clean Air / Abatement report.
- We do not accept any materials that are regulated by state or federal environmental or hazardous substance laws.
- Pre-consumer recyclables are acceptable only when received under pre-approved, written agreement.
