



COMMERCIAL SERVICES AGREEMENT SERVICE-SPECIFIC ATTACHMENT DISPOSAL ONLY

The following additional terms and conditions are applicable to Customers self-hauling material for disposal at DTG facilities:

1.0 RECEIPT AND DISPOSAL OF C&D WASTE

Customer retains DTG for the receipt, weighing, sorting, reclamation, and/or disposal of various non-putrescible construction, demolition, and general debris (e.g., plastics, glass, film, Styrofoam, cardboard, wood, etc.) for which Customer agrees to pay to DTG the corresponding price as designated in Section 2.0 below. DTG will reject and strictly prohibits the dumping or delivery of any load containing household garbage or hazardous waste. If Customer violates this section and delivers any materials that are not recyclable, that contain household garbage or that contain other prohibited materials (see Attachment A, Acceptable and Prohibited Materials), Customer will pay DTG the higher of: the garbage rate of \$140.00 per ton or the current disposal rate commercially available (including any related taxes and/or fees) as determined by DTG.

1.1. Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Reporting. Upon written Customer request, DTG will generate a monthly LEED report for LEED qualified loads declared by Customer's driver to the DTG scale attendant **AT THE TIME OF DROP**. No LEED reports will be generated for undeclared loads.

2.0 INITIAL PRICE TABLE

The initial price table is included in each Initial Price Page. Prices are subject to change without advance notice.

3.0 ACCEPTABLE & PROHIBITED MATERIALS

3.1 List Incorporated. The customer agrees that the list of Acceptable & Prohibited Materials attached in Attachment A is incorporated by reference.

3.2 Violation. Customers agree that delivery of any prohibited materials to DTG constitutes a violation of Section 1.0 because prohibited materials are not recyclable. Customer agrees that DTG may request Customer remove any prohibited materials from its load and/or site and/or charge Customer the disposal rate described and more fully referenced in Section 1.0 above.

4.0 "TWO BOX RULE"

Please note that the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission prefers that operators of construction or demolition sites where recyclable materials are generated and transported for recycling provide a separate container for nonrecyclable material that is collected by a certified hauler. Customer should maintain a separate container for non-recyclable material that is collected by a certified hauler.
